LRB-0956 modifies the SAGE program to allow school districts to renew their contracts.

Please revise the draft to include the following additional modification:

For schools with contracts that begin in the 2000-01 school year under s. 118.43 (3) (ar) and have an enrollment that is less than 50% low-income, require them to reduce class size to 15 only in kindergarten and 1st grade in all school years that the contract is in effect. (Under current law they are required to reduce class sizes in k - 2nd grades in the 2001 02 school year, and k - 3rd grades in the 2002-03 school year.)

Furthermore, limit these districts' reimbursement to \$2,000 times the number of low-income pupils in kindergarten and 1st grade.

Allow these schools to renew their contracts after the five year term has expired, but under the same terms described above. i.e., only for kindergarten and 1st grade classes.
