STATUTORY MODIFICATIONS

Department of Administration:
2001-03 Biennial Budget

Analyst: Robert Blaine

Subject: TANF / CCDF appropriation types and related sections.

Change s. 20.445(3)(mc) Federal block grant operations to establish the appropriation type as continuing.

Change s. 20.445(3)(md) Federal block grant aids to establish the appropriation type as continuing.

Create a provision under s. 49.175 (possibly expand s. 49.175 (2)) to authorize the secretary of the department of workforce development to recommend adjustments to the allocations under 49.175 (1) or reductions in department appropriations. The department has proposed the following language:

"When the secretary deems that economic conditions or federal funding authorizations warrant, the secretary may recommend to the secretary of administration that authorized department appropriations be reduced or that adjustments to allocations be made under s. 49.175(2) to reflect revenue deficiencies."

what approp?

In addition to the secretary of the department of administration's approval, this provision should also be subject to review by the Joint Committee on Finance under s. 13.10.

Intent: The department requests the authority to administratively address two potential situations which could affect the "TANF Program," or those programs identified under 49.175 (1). First, reauthorization of the TANF block grant will occur during FFY02. In the event that the state's block grant award is reduced, the department has requested codifying a process in statute to deal with such a situation. Second, the cash assistance caseload in Wisconsin is at its lowest level in near history. In the event that this caseload were to rise significantly, the department would need the authority to address this budget shortfall.

Create a provision under s. 49.175 requiring the department submit an annual report of revenues and expenditures, per the appropriations and allocations referenced in 49.175(1), to the Secretary of the Department of Administration and the Co-chairs of the Joint Committee on Finance. This report should be submitted no later than December 31 of every year for activities occurring in the previous state fiscal year.

Intent: Because TANF revenues are budgeted across several state and non-state agencies, and because expenditures in one program can affect the availability of funds for other programs, the department should annually account for all expenditures in the TANF program.

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Under current law, DWD is required to allocate specific amounts of moneys, including federal moneys received under the federal temporary assistance for needy families (TANF) block grant program, for various public assistance programs. These programs include the Wisconsin works (W-2) program, the kinship care program, and the head start program.

Under this bill, if the amounts of TANF moneys that are received from the federal government are less than the amount of TANF moncys appropriated to DWD, the secretary of workforce development is required to submit a plan to the secretary of administration for reducing the amounts of moneys allocated for the various public assistance programs. If the secretary of administration approves the plan, the secretary of administration must submit the plan to the joint committee on finance for review. If, within 14 days after the submittal, the cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the secretary of administration that the committee has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the plan, the plan may be implemented. If, within 14 working days after the submittal, the cochairpersons of the committee notify the secretary of administration that the committee has scheduled a meeting to review the proposed plan, the plan may be implemented only upon approval of the committee.

The bill also requires DWD ~~annually~~ to submit a report to the secretary of administration and the cochairpersons of ~~the joint committee on finance~~ on DWD's expenditures for the various public assistance programs for which DWD must allocate moneys. Finally, the bill changes the TANF appropriations from annual appropriations to continuing appropriations. JCF

Robert Blaine:

I changed the "redistribution" language in s. 49.175 (2), stats., to "reallocate" because this is what I believe was intended. The redistribution language permits DWD to redistribute moneys that have already been distributed from the appropriations for the various purposes under 49.175 (1), stats. This poses a problem because under the language DWD could distribute federal moneys and then redistribute them through PR or GPR accounts, which violates current law. It is my understanding that DWD and DOA intended s. 49.175 (2) to permit the reallocation of the moneys (meaning increasing and decreasing the amounts that must be allocated) and did not intend to permit the redistribution of moneys that have already been distributed from appropriations. If this is not the intent please call me to discuss the problems the redistribution language poses currently and possible solutions. *that*

In addition to the child care pieces, we also briefed on most of the TANF budget items. We still don't have final approval of the allocations, but we are getting close.

In the meantime, we need two additional changes to this draft. Basically, the Governor does not want to specify any JCF review, as we have included in 49.175(2)(b) (lines 9 through 20) and 49.175(3).

Here's the tricky part -- I'm not sure if we just deleted the references to JCF that the administration would be able to redirect TANF revenues if the our revenues came in less than expected. Since the allocations in 49.175(1) are statutory minimums, we would need some sort of language that would permit the administration (without Legislative review) to reduce the allocations.

Let me know if this is at all problematic.

To be frank, it may not be a bad idea to leave, for example, (br) more restrictive. The more I think about it, for a slew of reasons from audit issues to public accountability, it may be better to prevent DWD from spending public assistance studies money on state salaries costs. Since most of the other "smaller" appropriations in question are more for specific program purposes (fraud, FSET, etc.) this may be why the statues weren't crafted in a way that provides 100% flex between appropriations.

While I was not a part of creating the allocations, my understanding is that we went to this system to address two potential situations: 1) giving the department flexibility in meeting its maintenance of effort requirement, and 2) giving some wiggle room at the end of the FY by allowing the administration to supplement over-budget programs using money designated for programs that are under budget.

Given our time constraints, it may be better to just leave them alone and I will just make sure DWD knows that though 49.175 is supposed to give them some flexibility, there are some limitations. What do you think?

Hmmm...taking (br) as an example, the language of (bg) only allows DWD to use the moneys in that appropriation for public assistance reform studies. Legally the money can't be used for anything else. To permit DWD to use the moneys for another purpose under (g), we should add language like "and for any other purpose for which moneys must be allocated under s. 49.175 (1) (g)." If you want to give DWD a lot of room to maneuver, we should just reference s. 49.175 (1) generally.

I'm not so concerned necessarily about the broad allocations you mention. For example, (md) and (mc), I think, are fine--although it might not hurt to reference 49.175 (1). I'm more concerned that DWD may be drawing (or want to draw) from the narrowly drafted appropriations for purposes that aren't authorized. Does that make sense?

I thought you were going to get the weekend off? My condolences.

This could get tricky if we open up the bag of worms. What's tricky is that we have some appropriations [(a), (dz), (k), (mc), (md) and probably (nL)] which are broader than an allocation. (md), for example, is used to fund W-2, child care, community youth grants (and on and on). Other appropriations [(br), (e), (em), (jL), (L), (Lm), (pm) & (ps)] are components of broader allocations.

Most of what I will call "fungibility" affects a few key appropriations: (a), (dz), (k), (mc), (md) and probably (nL). These are the appropriations that multiple programs draw funding from and where the lines between, for example, a (dz) MOE expenditure and an (md) aids expenditure gets blurry. In the interests of time, it may be worth our while to make sure that 49.175 (1) allows for fungibility between these appropriations. The rest of the appropriations should have specific programs they are intended for -- for example, (br) which is our public assistance reform studies appropriation should only be used for this purpose. This purpose, by the way, is encompassed in our state admin. allocation under 49.175 (1)(g).

If DWD wanted to use (br) GPR for another program, we have two potential scenarios. First, they may want to use it for another purpose under 49.175(1)(g). My question for you is, do you think they could do that? Or, second, they may want to use it for another program identified in another allocation -- under this scenario, I think they would need to get authority as specified under 49.175 (2).

Confused yet? Alas, I am in the office as well. If you would like to discuss, give me a buzz. My next item of work is to look more closely at the issue that about gave you a coronary yesterday. I think we may be able to get by with little or no statutory changes (but I'm not holding my breath!).

Hi Robert:

I am working on 1303 and trying to figure out the best way to make the appropriations listed under s. 49.175 (1) "work". Currently, is the intent of s. 49.175 (1) to allow DWD to use the moneys in any of the appropriations listed for any of the programs listed under s. 49.175 (1)? If so, then I think each appropriation needs to be amended to permit the use of moneys for "any of the purposes for which moneys must be allocated under s. 49.175 (1)." For example, s. 20.445 (3) (br) is the appropriation for public assistance reform studies. If moneys in this appropriation are also to be used for purposes under sub. (1), it has to be amended because otherwise DWD can't use the money. The same is true for the other appropriations.

If some of the appropriations shouldn't be listed, then I need to know the appropriations you intend DWD to be able to "draw from" for the allocations.

1) Re "redistribute" and "reallocate" I guess I'm having difficulty seeing the difference between the two and difficulty understanding how, under current law, DWD could distribute FED through PR or GPR accounts. Most of the programs (but admittedly, not all) under (1) can be paid for with either FED, GPR, or PR. For example, we can spend either GPR or FED to pay for W-2 benefits under (1)(a); thus, there would not seem to be any reason for DWD to distribute FED through other accounts. With that said, I don't have a reason to disagree with the change to "reallocate." It just makes me curious why the language was drafted as "distribute" and "redistribute" to begin with.

2) On whether DWD has the authority to allocate funds under 49.175 (1) from some appropriations -- I'm not sure how to react without knowing which appropriations have you concerned. Certainly, I don't have any objections to making sure that DWD has such authority.

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Under current law, DWD is required to allocate specific amounts of moneys, including federal moneys received under the federal temporary assistance for needy families (TANF) block grant program, for various public assistance programs. These programs include the Wisconsin works (W-2) program, the kinship care program, and the head start program.

Under this bill, if the amounts of TANF moneys that are received from the federal government are less than the amounts of 'TANF' moneys appropriated to DWD, the secretary of workforce development is required to submit a plan to the secretary of administration for reducing the amounts of moneys allocated for the various public assistance programs. If the secretary of administration approves the plan, the secretary of administration must submit the plan to JCF for review. If, within 14 days after the submittal, the cochairpersons of JCF do not notify the secretary of administration that JCF has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the plan, the plan may be implemented. If, within 14 working days after the submittal, the cochairpersons of JCF notify the secretary of administration that JCF has scheduled a meeting to review the proposed plan, the plan may be implemented only upon approval of JCF.
