The following is a statutory language proposal for the 2001-03 biennial budget. If you have any questions, please contact me at 266-7973 or kirsten.grinde@doa.state.wi.us.

The intent of this request is to merge the Land Information Board into the Wisconsin Land Council and to increase the land record fee [s. 59.72(5)(a)] by \$1. Specifically, the modifications would:

- Add three (3) members to the Land Council
 - 1 member would be a representative from a public utility;
 - 1 would be a representative from a professional land information organization; and
 - 1 would be nominated by a statewide association whose purposes include support of a network of statewide land information systems.
- OTK* • Transfer the Land Information Board's duties (i.e., s. 16.967), funding and appropriations to the Department of Administration
- Modify the Land Council's responsibilities to replace the Technical Working Group [s. 16.023(1)(f)] with a land information working group. The responsibilities of the working group would include:
 - Studying and recommending land information standards;
 - Advising the Department of Administration on a Wisconsin land information system;
 - Advising the department on coordination of state and local land information; and
 - Reviewing county land records modernization plans and making recommendations on approval to the department.
- Modify the Land Council's responsibilities to include reviewing land information grant applications and advising the Department of Administration on grant distribution.
- OTK* • Also, modify the existing planning grant programs (comprehensive [s. 16.965] and transportation [s. 16.9651] planning grants) to have the Land Council review applications and advise the department on distribution but transfer approval authority to the Department of Administration.
- Repeal the August 31, 2003, sunset date for the Land Council [s. 16.023(3)].

JTK ✓ Retain current effective language under s. 59.72, but replace the Land Information Board with the Department of Administration. *rel 59.72(3)(b) + (c), (4), (5)(a)*

✓ ✓ Modify s. 59.43(2)(ag) and (e) to increase the first page recording fee by \$1 to \$11. The September 1, 2003 changes under the 1997 Wisconsin Acts relating to reduction of the fee to \$8 would be repealed.

✓ • Require the register of deeds to submit \$7 of the first page recording fee under s. 59.43(2)(ag) 1. and (e), less any amount retained by the county.

✓ • Allow the county to retain \$5 of the \$7 if the county meets the existing criteria.

✓ • The remaining \$2 of the first page recording fee would be submitted to the Department of Administration and be appropriated as program revenue for land information and planning activities.

✓ • These changes would be effective the effective date of the budget.

Under the current law, the Wisconsin land council exists in ~~the department of administration~~ (DOA). The purposes of the council include the following: 1) to identify and recommend to the governor land use goals and priorities; 2) to identify and study areas of conflict in the state's land use statutes, and conflicts between state and local land use statutes and ordinances, and recommend to the governor legislation to resolve the conflicts; 3) to study the development of a computer-based land information system and make recommendations to the governor in this area; 4) to identify procedures for facilitating local land use planning efforts and recommend to the governor legislation to implement the procedures; and 5) to gather and analyze information about the land use activities in Wisconsin of the federal government and American Indian governments. The council is required to submit to both houses of the legislature, and the governor, a report that evaluates its functions and activities. The report must be submitted not later than September 1, 2002.

This bill discontinues the council's function of studying the development of a computer-based land information system, and adds several new functions to the council's duties. Under the bill, the council must study and recommend land information standards, advise DOA on a Wisconsin land information system and on coordination of state and local land information, review county land records modernization plans, and review land information grant applications and advise DOA on grant distribution.

The council currently consists of 16 members. This bill adds ^{three} members to the council, one of whom would be a representative from a public utility, one of whom would be a representative from a professional land information organization, and one ^{of whom} who would be nominated by a statewide association whose purposes include support of a network of statewide land information systems.

The bill also repeals the current law August 31, 2003, sunset date for the council. For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.


