I have one additional drafting request for the 2001-2003 biennial budget.

- ✓ Please create a "Kids Cabinet" with the following representation:
- ✓ Governor
- ✓ Superintendent, Department of Public Instruction
- ✓ Secretary, Department of Health and Family Services
- ✓ Secretary, Department of Administration
- ✓ Secretary, Department of Workforce Development

It would have the following functions:

- 1) Ensure ^{improve} better coordination of programs for children across state agencies.
- 2) Make recommendations to the Governor and Legislature regarding funding levels and program modifications that would streamline existing child programs.
- 3) Administer a grant program:
 - a) Specify several program delivery models
 - b) Specify desired performance measures
 - ✓ c) Evaluate local proposals
 - ✓ d) Distribute funds

✓ The goal would be to fund those proposals that create better links between schools and the human service system, that aim to have children ready to learn when they arrive at kindergarten and/or that remove barriers to learning while in schools. The proposals should focus initially on children 0-5 but should continue to provide services to these children and their families, as needed, through middle school and high school. The programs should target "at-risk" families and should be voluntary.

✓ In addition to the above, please specify that it would be attached to DOA for administrative purposes and that all agencies would share the administrative expenses.

✓ Finally, create a new GPR- Annual appropriation at DOA to contain funding that the cabinet may allocate to various local entities submitting proposals.

The bill directs the board to make recommendations to the governor and the legislature relating to changes needed in state programs, policies, and funding levels to improve the coordination among state agencies of programs for children and to streamline the delivery of those programs. The bill also directs the board to award grants to local consortia, which are defined in the bill as combinations of individuals, public agencies, nonprofit corporations, for-profit organizations, federally recognized American Indian tribes or bands, or other persons, to provide models for the delivery of programs for children who are at risk of not being ready to learn when they enter kindergarten or who are at risk of facing barriers to learning while in school (at-risk children). A local consortium must use the grant to provide a model for the delivery of those programs that meets certain specifications prescribed by the board and that is designed to create links between school districts, human service providers, and other community-based providers of programs for

children; enable at-risk children to be ready to learn when they enter kindergarten or to overcome the barriers to learning that they face while in school; focus on providing services on a voluntary basis to children under ^{five} years of age and their families, but also provide services to children and their families, as needed, throughout the elementary and high school grades; and meet certain performance measures ^{prescribed} specified by the board.
