Subject: Statutory Language – Additional Budget Drafts for UW System

I'm forwarding a statutory language changes for UW System.

1. Direct the Board of Regents to provide a certain portion of courses during evenings and weekends, or via electronic means. **See Attachment 1.**

REQUIRE UW BOARD OF REGENTS TO OFFER MORE COURSES FOR NON-TRADITIONAL STUDENTS

Amend current statutory language to direct the UW Board of Regents to offer a certain portion of courses during evenings, weekends and via electronic means (on-line, asynchronous learning). The intent of the change is to increase the number of courses offered during non-traditional times and via non-traditional means, for the benefit of students who have other obligations (work, family), such that completing courses during the day, in a classroom, is not possible. That is, we're trying to encourage the UW System to increase efforts to serve adult ("non-traditional") students.

Currently, the statutes do include a reference to providing night courses. I believe we could amend the statute as follows:

s.36.09 Responsibilities. (1) THE BOARD OF REGENTS

(d) The board shall establish policies to guide program activities to ensure that they will be compatible with the missions of the institutions of the system. ~~To this end, the board shall make all reasonable effort to provide night courses~~ at least 10% of course sections offered throughout the System during the evening, on weekends or via electronic means.

- By "electronic means", I'm referring specifically to courses taught on-line, as opposed to general "distance education". Sometimes electronic or on-line courses are referred to as "asynchronous learning", because the student can review course materials (lecture notes, etc.) at their convenience - as opposed to receiving a lecture at a remote location in real time. We're trying to capture the non-real time (asynchronous) aspect of courses offered on-line. I think "electronic means" would capture this, but we can discuss the exact terminology, if you think there is problem.
- We are starting at 10% now, but as I look into the number of courses currently offered during evenings/weekends and via electronic means, we may revise that number.

Include a requirement that the Board of Regents report annually to DOA on the number of courses offered during the evening, on weekends, and via electronic means, as well as the proportion of total courses represented by the evening/weekend/on-line courses. Require UW to submit the report annually by December 1 for the year following the end of an academic year, beginning December 1, 2003 (for the 2002-03 academic year). We may move the first report back by one year if we find that the UW will need more time to do it.

We would like to include a provision about the methodology of the report:

- Require the UW to count each section of every course as a separate "course offering" in the calculation of the number and proportion of courses offered as evening/weekend/on-line courses.
- Ultimately, this specification may be dropped (or there may be interest in specifying in even greater detail how the UW should do the report), but I wanted to get it drafted, in case we go forward with it.

We would like to require that the only course sections that the Board could count towards this requirement are courses offered on a for-credit basis, and those that are available to undergraduates.

My suggestion (my additions are underlined):

SECTION 2. 36.11(41) of the statutes is created to read:

36.11 (41) OFFERING OF COURSE SECTIONS. The board shall ensure that at least 10% of all course sections offered on a for-credit basis throughout the system are offered during the evenings and weekends or by electronic means. The Board may not count towards this requirement any course that is not available to undergraduate students.

Can we change this section to read "... open to undergraduate students ..." instead of "...open ...open to both undergraduate and graduate students ..."?

The intent is to make sure that the UW does not count any courses that exclude undergraduates. However, we don't want to limit them to counting only course sections in which both grads and undergrads can enroll (there may be some courses for which grads are not eligible to enroll, but undergrads are - I'm not sure).
