Local youth apprenticeship partnerships provide administrative, program and financial support to the local youth apprenticeship programs.

Of the total amount awarded to local partnerships, \$752,700 in grants was awarded in 2000-01 to industry and labor associations to assist the local partnership in recruiting businesses and students to participate in local youth apprenticeship programs. This motion would prohibit using local youth apprenticeship awards to provide funding to businesses or business organizations and would delete \$752,700 annually that has been used for that purpose.


