

1 (b) On the effective date of this paragraph, 1.0 FTE position in the department  
2 of transportation performing duties primarily related to printing services and the  
3 incumbent employee holding that position, as determined by the secretary of  
4 administration, are transferred to the department of administration. The employee  
5 transferred under this paragraph has all the rights and the same status under  
6 subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230 of the statutes in the department of  
7 administration that the employee enjoyed in the department of transportation  
8 immediately before the transfer. Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4) of the statutes,  
9 no employee so transferred who has attained permanent status in class is required  
10 to serve a probationary period.

11 **\*-0832/5.9152\*** (3) AIRPORT FINANCING COMMITTEE. There is created an airport  
12 financing committee consisting of members appointed by the governor. The governor  
13 shall appoint members representing the department of transportation, the  
14 department of commerce, airport managers, airlines serving this state, the general  
15 aviation community, the people of this state, and private businesses having an  
16 interest in transportation policy and financing. The committee shall select its  
17 officers and the person appointed chairperson shall call the committee's first  
18 meeting. The committee shall review and evaluate this state's airport system needs  
19 and the current system of funding those needs and shall recommend changes, if any,  
20 to better meet those needs. The committee shall evaluate, among other things:  
21 aircraft registration fees; aviation fuel taxes and fees; allocation of sales tax receipts  
22 from the sale of aircraft, parts, and services; and the allocation of other moneys for  
23 airport financing. The committee's recommendations, if any, should, if enacted,  
24 generate revenue in amounts equal to or greater than the sum of moneys  
25 appropriated for aeronautical activities in fiscal year 2002. Not later than December

1 31, 2002, the committee shall submit a report containing the committee's evaluation,  
2 findings, and recommendations to the governor, and to the legislature in the manner  
3 provided under section 13.172 (2) of the statutes.

4 \*b0515/1.1\* (3d) PORT ARTHUR ROAD EXTENSION IN CITY OF LADYSMITH. From the  
5 appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (fq) of the statutes, as created by this act, the  
6 department of transportation shall allocate \$200,000 or 80% of the cost of the project,  
7 whichever is less, in the 2001–03 fiscal biennium to fund a project to close a portion  
8 of College Avenue in the city of Ladysmith and to extend Port Arthur Road east to  
9 STH 27 in the city of Ladysmith, if the city of Ladysmith provides a local contribution  
10 toward the costs of the project in an amount equal to at least 20% of the cost of the  
11 project.

12 \*b0600/1.1\* (3mp) OVERPAYMENT OF STATE TRANSIT OPERATING AIDS.  
13 Notwithstanding section 85.20 (4m) (er) of the statutes, the department of  
14 transportation shall waive repayment by the city of Rhinelander of any outstanding  
15 balance of overpayments of state transit operating aids distributed by the  
16 department to the city for the calendar years 1997 through 1999.

17 \*-0856/1.9152\* (4) GRANTS TO LOCAL PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL STADIUM DISTRICTS.  
18 From the appropriation under section 20.395 (1) (gr) of the statutes, as created by  
19 this act, the department of transportation shall award grants in January 2002 to a  
20 local professional football stadium district created under subchapter IV of chapter  
21 229 of the statutes for the development, construction, reconstruction, or  
22 improvement of parking lots, garages, transportation facilities, or other functionally  
23 related or auxiliary facilities or structures on the site of the existing parking lot  
24 facility, of a football stadium, as defined in section 229.821 (6) of the statutes. Within  
25 30 days of receipt of the grants under this subsection, the local professional football

1 stadium district shall provide all grant proceeds to the professional football team  
2 described in section 229.823 of the statutes to be used by the professional football  
3 team for the purposes of the grants specified in this subsection.

5 2001–03 fiscal biennium, from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (nx) of the  
6 statutes, the department of transportation shall award a grant to the city of Wausau  
7 for the project known as the City Square Park Pedestrian Pathway, if the city of  
8 Wausau contributes funds for the project that at least equal 20% of the costs of the  
9 project.

10 \*b0533/1.1\* (4d) HALFWAY CREEK BIKE TRAIL PROJECT. In the 2001–03 fiscal  
11 biennium, from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (nx) of the statutes, the  
12 department of transportation shall award a grant to the village of Holmen for the  
13 project known as the Halfway Creek Bike Trail, if a person, other than the state,  
14 contributes funds for the project that at least equal 20% of the costs of the project.

15 \*b0530/3.1\* (4nk) CLAYTON PEDESTRIAN FACILITY. In the 2001–03 fiscal  
16 biennium, the department of transportation shall construct a grade-separated  
17 pedestrian crossing of USH 45 in the town of Clayton in Winnebago County if the  
18 town of Clayton contributes funds for the project that at least equal 50% of the costs  
19 of the project.

20 \*b0650/2.2\* (4x) MENASHA RECREATIONAL TRAIL. Notwithstanding limitations  
21 on the amount and use of aids provided under section 86.31 of the statutes, as  
22 affected by this act, or on eligibility requirements for receiving aids under section  
23 86.31 of the statutes, as affected by this act, the department of transportation shall  
24 award a grant of \$25,000 in the 2001–03 fiscal biennium to the town of Menasha in  
25 Winnebago County for the construction of a recreational trail along Cold Spring Road

1 in the town of Menasha. Payment of the grant under this subsection shall be made  
2 from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (fr) of the statutes, as affected by this  
3 act, before making any other allocation of funds under section 86.31 (3) (b) of the  
4 statutes, and is in addition to the town of Menasha's entitlement, as defined in  
5 section 86.31 (1) (ar) of the statutes, to aids under section 86.31 of the statutes, as  
6 affected by this act.

7 **\*-2021/2.9152\*** (5) PARKING FACILITY GRANT. The department of transportation  
8 shall award a grant of \$420,700 to Kenosha County from the appropriation under  
9 section 20.395 (1) (bs) of the statutes, as affected by this act, in fiscal year 2001–02  
10 to provide 50% of the local share required for a congestion mitigation and air quality  
11 improvement project under section 85.245 of the statutes relating to a parking  
12 facility in the city of Kenosha. No grant may be awarded under this subsection unless  
13 Kenosha County makes a matching fund contribution toward the local share  
14 required for the project that is equal to the amount of the grant awarded under this  
15 subsection.

16 **\*b0422/3.14\*** (5w) MARQUETTE INTERCHANGE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT. From  
17 the appropriations under section 20.395 (3) (cr) and (cy) of the statutes, as created  
18 by this act, the department of transportation shall allocate \$160,643,900 in the  
19 2001–03 fiscal biennium, including \$75,150,000 in federal interstate cost estimate  
20 funds, for the Marquette interchange reconstruction project specified under section  
21 84.014 of the statutes, as created by this act. Except for the allocation of federal  
22 interstate cost estimate funds, the department may reduce the amount of any  
23 allocation under this subsection if allocating such amount would result in the loss  
24 of any federal highway funds. Funds from any allocation reduction under this  
25 subsection may be used to fund other southeast Wisconsin freeway reconstruction

1 projects. Funds allocated under this subsection for the Marquette interchange  
2 reconstruction project may not be used to fund interim repairs, as defined in section  
3 84.014 (1) (a) of the statutes, as created by this act.

4 **\*b0422/3.14\*** (5x) REQUEST ON SOUTHEAST WISCONSIN FREEWAY RECONSTRUCTION.  
5 By the date specified by the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance for the  
6 submission of requests for consideration at the next quarterly meeting of the  
7 committee under section 13.10 of the statutes occurring after the effective date of this  
8 subsection, the department of transportation shall submit a request for the transfer  
9 of moneys from the appropriations under section 20.395 (3) (cq), (cv), and (cx) of the  
10 statutes, as affected by this act, to the appropriations under section 20.395 (3) (cr),  
11 (cw), and (cy) of the statutes, as created by this act, to allocate funds for  
12 reconstruction of the southeast Wisconsin freeways. The department's request, and  
13 the committee's action on the request, may not include funding allocated for projects  
14 in other parts of the state or other funding that is not allocated to reconstruction of  
15 southeast Wisconsin freeways.

17 FUNDING. Notwithstanding section 16.42 (1) of the statutes, the department of  
18 transportation shall include in its 2003–05 biennial budget request to the  
19 department of administration a request for a grant of not more than \$5,000,000, to  
20 be funded from Indian gaming receipts, as defined in section 569.01 (1m) of the  
21 statutes, if additional funds are needed in the 2003–05 fiscal biennium to complete  
22 the West Canal Street reconstruction project specified under section 84.03 (3) of the  
23 statutes, as created by this act. If a request for additional funding is made under this

4 (a) The department of transportation shall study, and prepare a report on, the  
5 department's computerized information systems and the department's plan for  
6 utilizing its data processing resources, including the use of those resources for  
7 database redesign for the division of motor vehicles. In preparing its report under  
8 this paragraph, the department of transportation shall consult with the department  
9 of electronic government, as created by this act. The department of transportation  
10 shall include in the report recommendations concerning the potential benefits of  
11 coordinating data processing resource planning among other state agencies. By the  
12 date specified by the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance for submission  
13 of requests for consideration at the 4th quarterly meeting of the committee under  
14 section 13.10 of the statutes for the 2001–02 fiscal year, the department shall submit  
15 the report to the committee for review and approval.

19 responsibility for small projects requiring the services of an electrician.

20           2. On the effective date of this subdivision, the authorized FTE positions for the  
21 department of administration, funded from the appropriation under section 20.505  
22 (5) (ka) of the statutes, as affected by this act, are increased by 1.0 PR–S position
