- 1. **Establishment of Regional Service Delivery Centers** (offered by Musser) [LFB Paper 972] (Comparative Summary, pg. 779, Item #6)

Modify the Joint Committee on Finance provision that would have capped the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) from employing more than five regional coordinators. Allow DVA to employ no more than eight regional coordinators.

In addition, modify the Joint Committee on Finance provision that required DVA, with the concurrence of the Veterans Service Organizations, County Veteran Service Officers and the County Veteran Service Officer Organizations to request additional regional coordinator positions, under 14 day passive review.

The department must obtain the concurrence of the County Veteran Service Officer Organizations only, in order to obtain the additional regional coordinators.

Fiscal Impact: None

- 2. **National Guard Tuition Grant Program** [LFB Paper 605] (Summary Comparison, page 494, item #2)

The current program issues grants up to 100% of UW-Madison tuition, or the actual cost of tuition if less than that amount, per semester to any public or private school in or out-of-state. Current UW-Madison tuition is \$1645.00 per semester.

The Joint Committee on Finance proposal cut \$1.4 million of the Governor's proposal, by capping grants at \$1,000.00 per semester, which is less than 62% of the UW-Madison tuition.

This amendment restores the provision to fund in-state participants attending public and private schools at 100% based on the Fiscal Bureau's revised estimate of program costs at 100%. However, this proposal excludes future participants who attend out-of-state schools, except for schools with Wisconsin reciprocity agreements.

This amendment grandfathers all existing participants for 100% tuition grants until June 30, 2005. — But not exempt out-of-state, except reciprocity

50% of in-state private schools - if current NG member + enrolled can continue

Fiscal Impact: None. While this amendment will cost \$857,000 (GPR) over the existing Joint Committee on Finance action, it will be funded by excluding future participants who attend out-of-state schools and place a moratorium on the Badger Challenge Program administered by the Department of Military Affairs. Use \$280,000 each year of the biennium from the Badger Challenge Program and transfer these funds to support the National Guard Tuition Reimbursement Program. The motion would also delete a helicopter support services aid appropriation (\$150,000 each year). The combined Badger Challenge and

helicopter support aid amounts would produce \$860,000 to fund the above costs of \$857,300. The Challenge Academy Program administered by the Department of Military Affairs will not be effected by this amendment.

3. **Veterans Museum Operations [LFB Paper 166] (Comparative Summary, page 781, item #8)**

This will amend the funding source on the provision by the Governor to fund various Veterans Museum projects. In the Governor's budget, funding for the operations below are from the Veterans Trust Fund. This amendment changes that provision and funds these operations fifty-percent from tribal gaming funds and fifty-percent from the Veterans Trust Fund.

Programs to be funded by fifty-percent tribal gaming funds and fifty-percent from the Veterans Trust Fund:

-Museum Staffing: Temp assistant for data entry (\$31,00 for 2001-02 and \$33,100 for 2002-03)

-Museum Exhibit Enhancements: Installation costs for major special exhibit in November 2001 (\$30,000 one-time)

-Museum Exhibit Enhancements: Temporary exhibits on-going support (\$25,000 annually)

-Museum Exhibit Enhancements: Exhibit development for the WI National Guard education center and library ongoing support (\$50,000 annually)

-Other Museum Operations: Replacement of museum phone system (\$15,000 one-time)

-Other Museum Operations: Museum store sales re-estimate (\$15,000 annually)

-Other Museum Operations: Increased museum security costs (\$6,000 in 2001-02 and \$6,200 in 2002-03)

-Other Museum Operations: Distance learning program (\$60,200 one-time)

-Other Museum Operations: Public education programs (\$24,000 annually)

Fiscal Impact: Provide \$411,200 for the above operations fifty-percent from tribal gaming funds and fifty-percent from the Veterans Trust Fund.

4. **Veterans Emergency Aid Test Pilot Program (requested by Musser, motion request #103 (modified))**

This amendment adds a one-time pilot \$20,000 emergency aid program. These emergency funds will be used by "Families First" in Monroe County. Eligible
