2001 Assembly Resolution 52

ENGROSSED RESOLUTION

Relating to: requesting the U.S. Congress not to attempt to repeal or rescind any of the tax relief legislation passed by the U.S. Congress in May 2001.

Whereas, the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001 (H.R. 1836) was passed with bipartisan support; and

Whereas, the bill granted much-needed tax relief for all working families in Wisconsin; and

Whereas, some members of the U.S. Congress are calling for the repeal or delay of parts of the tax relief bill, which would in effect raise taxes on Wisconsin's families; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the assembly, That the members of the Wisconsin assembly respectfully request the U.S. Congress to leave the tax cuts in the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001 (H.R. 1836) intact, to allow the implementation or acceleration of the tax relief therein, and to add further tax relief measures if needed; and, be it further

Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall transmit copies of this resolution to the speaker and clerk of the U.S. house of representatives and to each member of the congressional delegation from this state.
