Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate


This bill appears to be identical to 1999 AB 549.

This bill prohibits any person, including public agencies, from disclosing any personal information about or obtained from a person under 18 years of age for commercial or trade purposes without the prior written consent of the parent or guardian of the child.

This legislative proposal contains provisions allowing enforcement by the Attorney General and the Department of Justice. The bill gives the parents and the Attorney General authority to petition for an injunction of the use of a child's personal information disclosed in violation of the provisions of the bill.

It is difficult to anticipate what or how many enforcement actions the department will have to take. However, if the various departments are complying with the provisions of the bill, we anticipate few complaints. Similar to the department's enforcement ability under the Open Records and Open Meetings Law, we anticipate that the department will be able to absorb any costs relating to this proposal.
