



2001 SENATE BILL 310

November 6, 2001 – Introduced by Senators JAUCH, MOORE, ERPENBACH, M. MEYER, ROBSON, HANSEN, BRESKE, BURKE, CHVALA, WIRCH, SHIBILSKI, DECKER, PLACHE, MOEN, BAUMGART, GROBSCHMIDT, GEORGE and RISSER, cosponsored by Representative SHERMAN. Referred to Committee on Insurance, Tourism, and Transportation.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 84.1037 of the statutes; **relating to:** designating STH 122 as
2 the Walt Bresette Equal Rights Highway.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill directs the department of transportation to designate and mark the entire route of STH 122 as the “Walt Bresette Equal Rights Highway” in recognition and appreciation of the life of Walt Bresette, a member of the Red Cliff band of the Lake Superior Chippewa who was active on issues concerning social justice, the environment, and tribal sovereignty.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 84.1037 of the statutes is created to read:
4 **84.1037 Walt Bresette Equal Rights Highway.** The department shall
5 designate and mark the route of STH 122, commencing at STH 77 at Upson and
6 proceeding northerly to the Wisconsin–Michigan border in Iron County, as the “Walt
7 Bresette Equal Rights Highway” in recognition and appreciation of the life of Walt
