



2001 SENATE BILL 344

December 6, 2001 - Introduced by Senators BURKE, WIRCH and SCHULTZ, cosponsored by Representatives TURNER and MUSSER. Referred to Committee on Universities, Housing, and Government Operations.

1 **AN ACT to create** 36.11 (45) of the statutes; **relating to:** development of a tribal
2 logo for notification of state grants funded by Indian gaming receipts.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Robert M. La Follette institute of public affairs at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, in consultation with American Indian tribes in Wisconsin, to develop a representative tribal logo for use on state notifications of grants funded by Indian gaming receipts and a plan to implement use of the logo and to submit the logo and plan to the joint committee on finance for approval.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 36.11 (45) of the statutes is created to read:
