Currently, tests are done every two years, and the 90-day window is more restrictive than necessary. We propose making the window 180 days instead of 90 days. The other provisions are references to the period of time prior to registration renewal in which a vehicle may be tested, and are simply changed to correspond to the 180-day period from 90-days.

STATEMENT OF SCOPE

DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECTIVE OF THE RULE:

Ch. Trans 131 governs the vehicle emission inspection program in Southeast Wisconsin. A provision of the rule establishes the times at which vehicles are required to be inspected, including that a vehicle must be inspected within 90 days before registration renewal expiration. This rule making will reflect a change in the number of days that vehicles are required to have an emission inspection prior to registration renewal.

DESCRIPTION OF EXISTING POLICIES RELEVANT TO THE RULE AND OF NEW POLICIES PROPOSED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RULE AND AN ANALYSIS OF POLICY ALTERNATIVES:

The 2001-03 biennial budget amends s.110.20(6)(a)1., Stats., to require that, instead of 90 days prior to registration renewal, a vehicle must be inspected within the time period specified by the Department of Transportation. This rule making will amend s. Trans 131.03(2)(a) to require inspection no more than 180 days prior to renewal of annual registration. This amends the current requirement for inspection no more than 90 days prior to renewal of annual registration.

ANALYSIS OF FINAL DRAFT OF TRANS 131

- (a) Need for Amended Rule. This rule making proposes to amend Trans 131.03(2)(a) which requires a vehicle registrant to obtain an emission test within 90 days prior to registration renewal. Originally, emission testing was done every year. Existing policy that the vehicle must be tested within 90 days prior to registration renewal was intended to assure that no more than 15 months would have passed between a vehicle's testing. Currently, tests are done every two years, and the 90-day window is more restrictive than necessary. We propose making the window 180 days instead of 90 days. The other provisions are references to the period of time prior to registration renewal in which a vehicle may be tested, and are simply changed to correspond to the 180-day period from 90-days.
- (b) Modifications as a Result of Testimony at Public Hearing. Notice of intent to adopt this proposed rule without public hearing was given under the procedure set forth in s. 227.16(2)(e), Stats. No one petitioned for a public hearing and no public hearing was held.
- (c) <u>List of Persons who Appeared or Registered at Public Hearing</u>. Because there was no hearing, there were none.
- (d) Response to Legislative Council Recommendations. The Legislative Council report contained no recommendations to the proposed rule.
- (e) <u>Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis</u>. This proposed rule will have no adverse impact on small businesses.
