# Senate Amendment \_\_\_ (LRBa0719/1)

Senate Bill 224 relates to the determination of annual salaries for the director and the executive assistant of the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS). Under current law, the director of WTCS is assigned to executive salary group (ESG 6). Senate Bill 224 eliminates the ESG assignment of the director and establishes a WTCS senior executive salary system. Under the bill, two salary groups are established for the WTCS. The executive assistant of the WTCS is assigned to "general senior executive group 1" and the director is assigned to "general senior executive group 2." The salary range for these WTCS salary groups will be established in the plan that is submitted to the Joint Committee on Employment Relations for approval.

Senate Amendment \_\_ (LRBa0719/1) makes a technical change to a provision in ch. 20, relating to executive assistants. Section 20.923 (9), Stats., requires salaries for executive assistants to be set by the appointing authority. However, under that statute, the salary for an executive assistant may not exceed the maximum of the salary range *two ranges below* the salary range of the executive salary group to which the department or agency head is assigned. Because there are only two salary groups created for the WTCS, compliance with this statute is not possible. To resolve this conflict, Senate Amendment \_\_ (LRBa0719/1) exempts the executive assistant to the director of the WTCS from s. 20.923 (9), Stats.

Senate Bill 224 was introduced on July 12, 2001, by the Joint Committee on Employment Relations and referred to the Committee on Education. The Committee on Education held a hearing on the bill on October 9, 2001.

#### Senators:

During the hearing on 2001 Senate Bill 224 held on October 9, you requested that DER provide information on the salary ranges of the Executive Salary Groups (ESG) of the state agency officers. You also requested comparative data regarding salaries, and salary ranges for the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS), the University of Wisconsin, other colleges in Wisconsin and technical college systems in other states.

Here is the information we have gathered:

### **Executive Salary Groups (ESG)**

The positions assigned to each group are specified in s 20.923 (4)(a). The salary ranges are set by the Joint Committee on Employment Relations in the biennial compensation plan. The current assignments and ranges for fiscal year 2002 are:

You requested information on salaries in other states. We have this data from the Administrative Compensation Survey conducted by the College and University Professional Association for Human Resources. The data reflects education institutions with budgets of \$93.8 million or more. The system-wide budget for the WTCS, including expenditures for all 16 technical college districts is \$700 million.

The survey also gave the following data on two-year institutions with budgets of \$32 million or more.

DER agrees with the WTCS that the ranges requested for the System Director and the Executive Assistants are within the mid-range of the education market outlined in the tables above. DER also agrees that these positions are suitable for a salary structure developed in comparison with peer institutions rather than the ESG structure developed for the executive agency hierarchy. DER does feel it is appropriate that most positions within the ESG structure are best placed in a ladder organization but that this is not required for positions in education administration.
