Dear Senator Moen:

Re: Private Health Care Coverage Board

I have been appointed by the Governor as one of two members to represent the public interest on the Private Health Care Coverage Board. The Board has the important task of overseeing the Department of Employee Trust Funds in seeking to establish health care coverage for small businesses in Wisconsin.

By way of brief introduction, I am a graduate of the University of Wisconsin School of Business and Law. I am admitted to practice law in Wisconsin and am the former President of the Sheboygan County Bar Association. I retired from Kohler Co. in 1998 as Senior Vice President Human Resources and was a member of Kohler's Board of Directors and Executive Committee.

My position at Kohler was responsible for employee benefits for 19,000 employees world wide, including 7,000 in Wisconsin. I actively participated in establishing health care plans, including negotiations with labor unions and care providers. In doing so, I believe I gained an insight in how health care is delivered in our economy, its costs, and the need for very active participation by employers in the process since a major portion of our citizens are covered under plans provided by employers.

Large employers have an advantage in delivering "market share", i.e. large numbers of their employees, to the health care providers and accordingly have some, albeit limited, influence on the providers. This is not the case, unfortunately, for smaller Wisconsin employers, who must pay much higher premiums to cover their employees, or not provide coverage at all. The intent of the SB1/AB63 passed in 1999 is to have the State assist small business in combining to obtain affordable health care coverage for their employees.

This will not be an easy task for the economic forces at play in providing health care and insurance therefore are many and are complex. But, if confirmed, I will provide whatever assistance I can to accomplish this laudatory objective.

Department of Health and Family Services Secretary-designate Phyllis Dubé

Thank you, Chairman Moen, and other members of the Senate Health, Utilities, Veterans and Military Affairs Committee for this opportunity to speak. My name is Lon Newman. I am the President of the Wisconsin Family Planning and Reproductive Health Association. I am employed as executive director of Family Planning Health Services, Inc. -- a private non-profit corporation serving seven counties in Central Wisconsin. Our headquarters is in Wausau.

Our association has been working to authorize and implement a law passed in 1997 that would give women of reproductive age who are under 185% of poverty, access to Medicaid-subsidized family planning services. If the law had been implemented as the legislature intended, in July of 1998, according to the Department of Health and Family Services' estimates, 46,000 women would have received these services and taxpayers would have saved \$19,600,000 so far. But the law has **not** been implemented because the work to get it implemented has **not been done**.

In August of last year, members of our association, and legislative aides of members of this committee met with Secretary-designate Phyllis Dubé and the division administrator of Health Care Finance, Peggy Handrick. At that meeting, Secretary-designate Dubé seemed genuinely interested and supportive of the family planning waiver. The Division of Health Care Finance at that time took the necessary steps to maintain the viability of the family planning waiver. Six months later, it's still viable, but once again it's stalled in the Division of Health Care Finance.

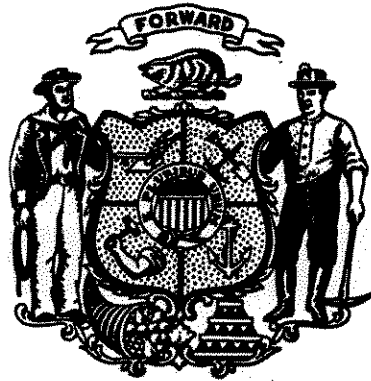
We are convinced that Secretary-designate Dubé sincerely does support this law's implementation. We are asking her to enforce a 'do-or-die deadline' of January 2, 2003 as the date that women will be receiving these important services. With that support for women's and children's health, we support her confirmation as Secretary of Health and Family Services.

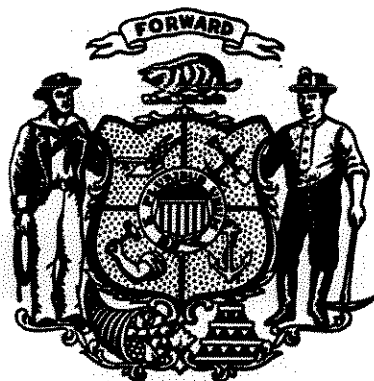

In his latter role as an attorney with WPPI, he and I worked together on many projects and issues. Over the course of his tenure at WPPI (mentoring under WPPI CEO Roy Thilly), Bert gained valuable insights into how the utility industry really operates, from the perspective of a consumer-owned electric utility. He witnessed first-hand the games that the large private utilities play (e.g., a large Wisconsin utility illegally denying transmission service to WPPI, a case that was ultimately decided by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission). He saw how many of those private utilities thought about profits or shareholders first, and customers second. He watched as WPPI system control operators did their best to move electric power into the state, working against a highly constrained high-voltage transmission interface to the west.

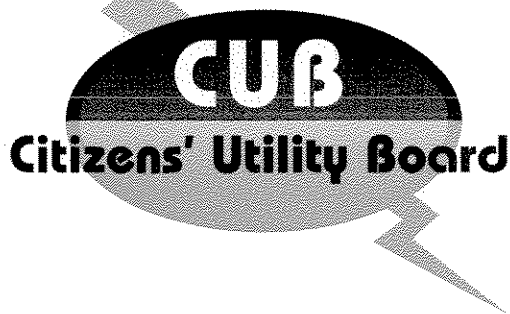

CUB urges that the Senate Committee on Health, Utilities, Veterans and Military Affairs approve the appointment of Mr. Garvin.



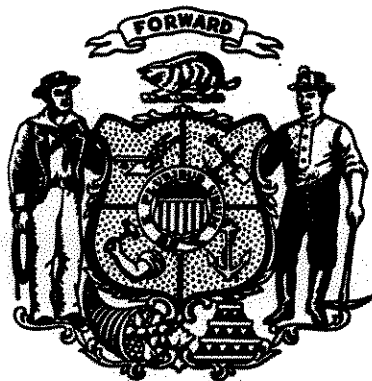
