Dear Senator Breske and Members of the Senate Insurance, Tourism and Transportation Committee:

The American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) is a not-for-profit organization with 270,000 members nationwide. On behalf of our 7,200 Wisconsin members, we ask that you support the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Motorcycle Safety Program by voting "yes" on Senate Bill 388. This bill increases funding for the program for each fiscal year of the 2001-03 fiscal biennium by \$200,000.

The Wisconsin Motorcycle Safety Program trained over 4,900 novice riders during 1998. This number represents just a portion of the residents who attempted to enroll in the program. Demand outpaced supply by a wide margin.

The additional funding provided by SB-388 demonstrates Wisconsin's commitment to expanding rider education opportunities for those who wish to ride motorcycles for transportation and recreation.

The AMA supports SB-388 and respectfully requests that the members of the Senate Insurance, Tourism and Transportation Committee approve this measure. Thank you for your kind consideration.

1. Thank you.
2. Program Summary
  - a. Required participation for:
    - i. Riders under the age of 18
    - ii. Riders applying for a 3<sup>rd</sup> "learner permit" without passing a road test administered by the DMV
    - iii. Riders who have twice failed the road test administered by the DMV
  - b. 15 of the 18 program providers are technical colleges that are part of the WI Technical College System.
3. Bill History
  - a. Waiting lists (2,700 in 9-01)
  - b. \$860K SB55, \$406K vetoed in Act 16
  - c. \$406K draft, \$200K amendment
  - d. Passed Assembly Highway Safety Committee and Assembly floor unanimously
4. Reasons for passage recommendation
  - a. If rider education courses are not easily available to new riders, they will often bypass the formal training and operate their motorcycles without the knowledge and skills needed to do so safely.
  - b. Drivers aren't learning how to drive in untested conditions until it's too late. These bills address the need to prepare new drivers in Wisconsin to handle motorcycle vehicles those conditions ahead of time.
  - c. 9 out of 10 crashes on dry pavement
  - d. 2000 - 78 killed\*, 2014 injured
  - e. Drivers under 25 - 4% of riders, 35% of crashes
  - f. AB 593 & SB 388 will allow Wisconsin to get at-risk drivers into courses sooner, providing preventative driving instruction.

\* Y2000 fatalities marked a high over the previous decade, with the lows occurring in Y1992 and Y1993 with 40 fatalities in each year.








