## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Under current law, the Milwaukee Area Technical College may establish and operate a charter school. Milwaukee Area Technical College is the only technical college authorized to operate a charter school. Milwaukee Area Technical College has not established a charter school nor does it operate a charter school.

AB 261 would allow pupils who reside outside the Milwaukee school district to attend independent charter schools located in the Milwaukee school district. The bill also explicitly authorizes a school board to transport pupils to and from a charter school.

## **Long-Range Fiscal Implications**

Since Milwaukee Area Technical College does not operate a charter school, the provisions of AB 261 will have no short or long term fiscal effects on the Milwaukee Area Technical College District. Since no other technical college operates a charter school in the Milwaukee School District (or any other school district), AB 261 will have no short or long term fiscal effect on the Wisconsin Technical College System.
