## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill permits certain persons to go armed with a concealed and dangerous weapon. It also creates a procedure by which a person may apply to a county sheriff for a license to carry a concealed weapon and specifies the requirements that a person must satisy in order to qualify for such a license. Persons who are denied a license may appeal the action to the circuit court.

It is impossible to predict numerous things under this bill including: 1) the number of sheriffs/counties that will opt to permit the issuance of such licenses; 2) the number of violations of the new licensing law that will occur, and 3) the number of judicial reviews that will be requested by persons who are denied a license. Additional proceedings require additional judge, court reporter, court staff and juror time. These costs are borne by both the state and the county. An accurate estimate of the additional costs is impossible with the data available.

The requirement that the clerk of circuit court notify the sheriff when persons are charged with felonies and various misdemeanors and when they are convicted of those same crimes as well as various other deferred prosecution agreements, injunctions, civil involuntary commitments, etc. would significantly impact the workload of the clerk's office. It is not known if the urban area courts would be able to handle this requirement with existing staff. The clerk of circuit court's office is county funded.
