Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SB 204 requires OCI to promulgate a rule that would divide Wisconsin into 5 geographic areas for the purpose of organizing health care purchasing coops. While there is an expense for developing and promulgating any administrative rule, it may be possible for OCI to absorb those costs within OCI's existing budget, however, the requirements placed on OCI may require outside consultation.

It may be necessary to obtain actuarial assistance in order to determine the geographic breakdown of the five health purchasing co-operatives. Aligning the appropriate population and health care cost areas as well as other compiled demographic information as deemed necessary. OCI does not have an actuary on staff and would have to contract for those services.

Local Government costs are indeterminate. It is not possible to determine what cooperative health purchasing groups will be charging for health insurance premiums to determine if this will provide enough incentive for Local Government entities to shift their health care purchasing decisions.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
