## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill requires certain health care plans, including plans offered by the state to its employees, to cover the cost of vaccinations against diseases or malfunctions caused by a biological agent that could be used in a terrorist attack.

This bill will have no fiscal impact on the Office of State Employment Relations.

The fiscal impact on state government as a whole, and on local governments whose health plans are covered by the bill, is indeterminate. Statutory requirements expanding the mandatory coverage of health plans offered by state and local government have the potential to increase the costs of the health plans to governmental units and their employees. However, the Office of State Employment Relations lacks sufficient information to estimate the potentially increased costs for state or local government.
