Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would reduce the number of cases that are sent by law enforcement to District Attorneys' Offices. The amount of the reduction is unknown as there is no data on current cases received by DA offices that would have been not been sent had this bill been law in the past. On the other hand, the increased defenses available under this bill, if prosecution goes forward, may increase the number of cases that are received that go to trial rather than are settled by a plea bargain and thus would increase DA workload an unknown amount.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The actual impact of this bill, if enacted, must be closely monitored to determine if additional proseutorial resources are needed.
