Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

As AB 912 is written, there is no direct state fiscal effect as no additional testing, inspection or recordkeeping by state and local agencies is required.

However, the short and long term indirect costs are undetermined and may be high due to necessary state and local follow-up of human illnesses resulting from consumption of raw milk where pathogenic bacteria is present.

Unknown
