Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would not change the number of cases that are referred to district attorneys' offices by law enforcement. The restrictions created by this bill might affect the workload of a very few district attorneys' offices in an extremely small number of cases by increasing the time needed to complete the prosecution of those cases. In nearly all district attorneys' offices, this bill would have no impact on workload, as it would not require any change in current procedures.
