## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

If enacted this bill would provide alternatives to incarceration for non-violent drug or alcohol substance abusers.

The Department's Division of Hearings and Appeals (DHA) administers revocation hearings for individuals charged with violating the terms of their parole, probation, or extended supervision. Few of the individuals appearing before the Division meet the conditions of this bill. Most cases involve violent offenders, non-drug offenses or those with multiple drug convictions. Consequently this bill will have minimal impact on workload.

This bill is contingent on funding being available to cover the additional costs for substance abuse treatment and the court system. Counties are required to submit estimated costs for implementing the bill to DOA. DOA is also required to prepare a similar cost estimate for state agencies. Based on the information compiled, DOA is to assess whether adequate resources are available to implement the bill. This will require approximately 300 staff hours to develop the county survey, compile data and prepare a recommendation. This work effort is valued at \$10,500 based on an average salary/fringe rate of \$35 per hour. For purposes of this estimate, this cost is assumed to be one-time. However, if it is determined that insufficient funds are available, this process will need to be repeated every 12 months.
