



## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

**2003 Senate Bill 40**

**Senate Amendment 1**

Under **current law**, certain highway routes and bridges have been designated and marked to memorialize, commemorate, or recognize certain individuals or events.

**Senate Bill 40** directs the Department of Transportation to designate and, upon receipt of sufficient contributions from interested parties, mark the route of USH 14 in this state from the Wisconsin-Illinois border to **Richland Center, Wisconsin** as the “Ronald Reagan Highway” in recognition and appreciation of the public career of Ronald Reagan, 40th President of the United States.

**Senate Amendment 1** substitutes “Madison” for “Richland Center” in the bill so that the Ronald Reagan Highway” would be from the Wisconsin-Illinois border to **Madison, Wisconsin**.

### **Legislative History**

**Senate Amendment 1**, offered by Senator Schultz and others, was adopted by the Senate on a voice vote. **Senate Bill 40**, as amended by Senate Amendment 1, passed the Senate on a voice vote on May 6, 2003.
