Brief Description of Intent:

Modify § 20.505 (4)(ba) to indicate that, if the appropriation is insufficiently funded to meet anticipated contributions, annual membership or dues costs, or expenses of committees created by law or executive order, the Governor may pro-rate payments for these costs, notwithstanding other sections of the statutes.

20 governor shall report such authorized expenditures to the joint committee on finance
21 at the next quarterly meeting of the committee. If the governor desires to authorize

7 state superintendent of public instruction, one senator and one representative to the
8 assembly selected as are the members of standing committees in their respective

11 shall be designated by the governor from among its members. Members Except as
