

40.65 is the statute pertains to disabilities that cops and firefighters (EMS) get at work. What we are doing is saying that if a cop/firefighter is injured or develops a disease that makes them eligible for a disability and eventually dies from that injury/disease then family is eligible for tuition remission.

It does not mean that if for example that a cop has a hand shot off and gets disability but then dies years later from something else, the family would not get tuition remission.

I think the best way to get this drafted would be to do something like:

Amend 36.27 3m (b) 1. by adding something like "or a death resulting from a 40.65 disability" after "...killed in the line of duty..."

That same phase should also be added in the following 3 locations:

1. 36.27 3m (b) 2.
2. 38.25 (5) 1.
3. 38.25 (5) 2.

Chapter 36 is the UW statutes and 38 the Voc Colleges.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law grants a full remission of fees to a resident undergraduate student registered at the University of Wisconsin System (UWS) who is the child or surviving spouse of an ambulance driver, correctional officer, emergency medical services technician, fire fighter, or law enforcement officer who was killed in the line of duty in Wisconsin. Current law also grants "duty" disability benefits to a participant in the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) who develops a permanent work-related disability (qualifying disability) that forces the employee to retire or to reduce his work assignment.

This bill extends this fee remission to the child or surviving spouse of an ambulance driver, correctional officer, emergency medical services technician, fire fighter, or law enforcement officer who was a participant in WRS, qualified for duty disability benefits, and later died from the qualifying disability.
