Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Addressing only the impacts relevant to the Department of Transportation.

This bill would exempt the gasoline and diesel fuel sold to and used by the Airport District created by the bill from the state fuel tax. The result of this provision will, therefore, be a reduction in segregated Transportation Fund revenues. At this time, the reduction in Transportation Fund revenues due to this bill is indeterminate due to the lack of available data on gasoline and diesel fuel use at the qualifying airport and any expansion resulting from the creation of a new governing body.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Cumulative reductions in segregated Transportation Fund revenues.
