Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

If enacted, this bill creates the Healthy Wisconsin Authority (HWA). The Authority would consist of a 13 member board of directors. The Authority would be charged with the task of studying options for implementing a program for providing reinsurance to groups and individuals in the state for catastrophic claims under group and individual health insurance policies. The Authority would be required to submit a report with their findings and recommendations to the Secretary of the Department of Administration by Nov. 15, 2006. If further legislation is then introduced and passed, the HWA would then develop and administer the reinsurance program.

Board members would not be compensated for their participation, but could be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses related to meetings and travel. Wisconsin s. 20.505 (1)(ka) allows DOA to pay for the expenses of committees created by law or executive order. Per Wisconsin s. 16.40(14), the governor may authorize each committee to make expenditures from the appropriation under s. 20.505 (1)(ka) not exceeding \$2000 per fiscal year. The Department of Administration would reimburse board members for their actual expenses up to the \$2000 limit per fiscal year.
