Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under a current law, a person selling alcohol beverages must possess a license or permit authorizing the sale of alcohol beverages. A "Class C" license authorizes the retail sale of wine by the glass or in an opened original container for consumption on the premises where sold. A "Class C" license may be issued for a restaurant in which the sale of alcohol beverages accounts for less than 50 percent of gross receipts and that either does not have a barroom or has a barroom in which wine is the only intoxicating liquor sold.

Under this bill, a "Class C" license may be issued for a barroom with a seating capacity not exceeding 50 persons in which wine is the only intoxicating liquor sold and meals are not served. For such an establishment, however, the bill only authorizes the retail sale of wine by the glass rather than by glass or opened original container.

The bill is not expected to impact local government costs. A minor increase in local government revenues may be generated. The Department expects no additional administrative costs under the bill.
