Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary: AB132 directs the Department to consider the results that dam removal will have on the safety, health and welfare of the persons who will be affected by the removal.

Fiscal Impact: Language provided in AB 132 reinforces current practice by the Department of Natural Resources in handling dam removal cases, and would not result in increased costs. There would be no fiscal impact on the Department.

Removals of large dams require preparation of an Environmental Assessment (EA). The EA provides a format for assessing the anticipated effects of dam removal which includes the results that removal will have on the safety, health and welfare of people affected by the removal. Small dam removals do not necessarily require an EA, but staff routinely go through a similar review process to decide on permit conditions.

All current processes provide for an opportunity for a public information hearing or a contested case hearing prior to the removal. These public meetings are an opportunity for those who may be affected by the removal to voice their concerns. The Department can place conditions on the removal to mitigate effects to safety, life, health or property.

In summary, AB132 provides language that reinforces what should be current practice by the Department of Natural Resources in evaluating dam removal projects.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The legislation emphasizes criteria that are already used by staff when evaluating dam removal applications. Therefore, the immediate and long term fiscal impacts should be minimal
