Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

In Fiscal Year 2004 the Common School Fund received a total of \$8.8 million under Chapter 348 and other fines and forfeitures. If we assume all fines and forfeitures in fiscal year 2004 were collected after 120 days of being imposed then the state would have a decrease in revenue of \$2,059,378.31. If we assume all fines and forfeitures in fiscal year 2004 were collected within 120 days of being imposed then the state would have a decrease in revenue of \$1,029,686.61.

It is impossible to determine the exact fiscal impact of this bill because we do not know the amount of fines and forfeitures that are collected within 120 days and we do not know the amount of fines and forfeitures that are collected after 120 days of being imposed.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Common School Fund earnings would be less, therefore aid to K-12 libraries would be reduced.
