Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, if a person commits a misdemeanor before he or she reaches the age of 21, a court may order that the court's record regarding the offense be expunged upon the offender's successful completion of his or her sentence. This bill makes the expungement option available for offenders of all ages, and the court may enter an order authorizing expungement at any time during or after the sentence.

The Department of Corrections (DOC) is responsible for entering amended orders for probationers into the Department's database. Under this bill there will likely be an increase in the number of amended orders that would need to be entered.

The amount of time required to process orders at the county level would also likely increase under this bill. There would be additional requests made for records to be expunged, and additional copy work of court files would also be required.

Since it is not possible to project how many additional expungement requests and/or orders would need to be processed by DOC or counties, it is not possible to determine the state or local cost increases resulting from this bill.
