## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

If enacted this bill would direct state agencies to provide information regarding procurements to the Ethics Board. The Ethics Board would maintain a web-based system enabling the public and other interested parties to view this information.

The State Bureau of Procurement, in the Department of Administration, oversees procurements conducted under the provisions of Chapter 16. There are approximately 850 solicitations annually in excess of \$25,000. No information is maintained for procurements between \$10,000 and \$25,000, but these would likely increase the total required postings significantly. Additionally, no information is maintained for change orders over \$10,000. The Division of State Facilities issues about 420 construction contracts per year. The number of contracts issued under other statutory provisions in the bill is unknown.

Depending upon the process and web-based tools implemented by the Ethics Board the Department estimates this bill will add between 15 and 20 minutes per procurement, change order, etc. to post the required information to the Ethics Board website. However, without more detailed information on the functionality of the website, contracts between \$10,000 and \$25,000, or change orders above \$10,000, it is not possible to project the workload increase as the result of this bill. Consequently, the Department is unable to project whether it or other agencies can absorb this workload using existing staff.
