Requiring certain vehicles that are used to transport children to and from a child care provider to have child safety alarms installed, granting rule-making authority, extending the time limit for emergency rule procedures, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, and providing a penalty

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would require certain vehicles that are used to transport children to and from a child care provider to have child safety alarms installed. If the alarm has not been installed, is not properly maintained, or is not in good working order, the bill provides a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment not to exceed one year in a county jail or both.

The Department does not have the data to determine this bill's fiscal impact. Since the maximum penalty for these provisions is less than one year, there should not be an impact on Department of Corrections' (DOC) institutional populations, but there would be a local impact if an offender is sentenced to a jail term under the provisions in this bill. There may be an impact on DOC field populations if individuals are convicted and placed on probation.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
