Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would grant exclusive jurisdiction to municipal courts for proceedings against juveniles 12 to 15 years of age regarding municipal traffic ordinance violations. This bill will have no fiscal impact on the Department of Corrections.

There may be an impact on local municipalities as a result of a caseload shift from circuit courts to municipal courts. It is not possible to determine how many caseloads would be shifted from one court to another, so the fiscal impact of the bill is unknown.
