Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would not increase the number of cases referred by law enforcement to district attorneys offices for prosecution, by the removal of the prohibition on felons and their relatives, and, by increasing the penalties, possibly increase the number of jury trials as opposed to plea bargains that would result. There are no data by which to assess the specific impact of this bill were it to become law.
