Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill provides state aid to a tribal school in an amount that is calculated by multiplying the Indian Student Equalization Program (ISEP) base unit value determined by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) for the prior school year times the number of non–ISEP eligible pupils at the tribal school during the tribal school's pupil count week in a school year. The general purpose is, for each non–ISEP eligible pupil, to pay each tribal school (including a tribal school that does not have a contract with or receive a grant from the BIA) approximately the amount that would have been allotted to the tribal school by the BIA under ISEP for the basic educational program if the the pupil were ISEP eligible.

State Fiscal Effect

The bill creates an appropriation to the Department to fund the new state aid payment. The appropriation uses tribal gaming revenues paid to the state. The bill provides an appropriation of \$375,700 for FY 2006-07, which is based on the current estimate of the number of non–ISEP pupils enrolled in the four tribal schools (94) multiplied by the ISEP base unit value for the 2004–05 school year of \$3,996, rounded to the next \$100. The bill provides for prorating the amount if the funds are not sufficient in a school year.

The bill also requires submission to DPI of information about the non–ISEP pupils used to calculate the state aid, and creates a mechanism to verify the information about the non–ISEP pupils. The aid payment, pupil reporting and verification requirements will increase operating costs to the Department. It is assumed that these will be absorbed within current appropriations.
