Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Current law requires each school board to provide transportation for a child with a disability to any public or private elementary or high school, to the school operated by the Wisconsin Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired or the school operated by the Wisconsin Educational Services Program for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, or to any special education program for children with disabilities sponsored by a state college or university. This requirement is true regardless of distance, if the request is approved by the state superintendent.

This bill would eliminate approval by the state superintendent and instead require transportation, when it is not otherwise required, if the child has an individualized education program that requires transportation to school and the child resides less than two miles from school, if the child has been placed in the private school by a school board, and if the child's parent or guardian has not refused a school board's placement of the child in a public school.

State Fiscal Effect: None.

Local Fiscal Effect:

While clarifying district responsibility with respect to transporting pupils with disabilities, the bill is not expected to have a fiscal effect on school districts.
