## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill defines a "neighborhood electric vehicle" as a vehicle that conforms to the definition and requirements for low-speed vehicles (LSV's) under federal National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) regulations.

The bill provides that any city, town, or village may pass an ordinance that allows operation of neighborhood electric vehicles (LSV's) on any roadways that it has jurisdiction over. Also, the city, village, or town may license neighborhood electric vehicles (LSV's) used within its limits.

Local fiscal estimate only is requested for this bill.

Local fiscal impact is indeterminate, since DOT does not know how many cities, villages, and towns might allow neighborhood electric vehicles (LSV's) and what enforcement costs any city, village, or town might incur. In addition, DOT does not know how many cities, villages, and towns might register neighborhood electric vehicles (LSV's) at what fee, and thus how much revenue might be anticipated.
