The Volunteer Fire Fighter and Emergency Medical Technician Service Award Program and the exclusion of wages earned for services performed as a volunteer fire fighter, emergency medical technician, or first responder from partial unemployment benefit determinations

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

If enacted this bill would make several changes to the Volunteer Fire Fighters and Emergency Medical Technician Service Award Program.

Currently counties and municipalities may offer emergency medical services programs. However the length of service awards currently are restricted to those programs offered by municipalities.

This bill adds counties to those eligible to participate. The department estimates that this provision will add 6 to 8 county departments covering 240 fire fighters and EMTs to the program. The current state match amount is \$274.33 per participant. Consequently, this would increase GPR payments by a maximum of \$65,800. Since county and municipality contributions can exceed the state contribution, the local impact cannot be determined.

In addition to counties, the bill adds first responders to the list of those eligible to participate. Based on testimony by the Wisconsin EMS Association, most first responders are already covered under the fire fighter portion of the program. Consequently this provision will have a minor state fiscal impact. The impact on local costs cannot be determined as contributions will vary by county or municipality.

The bill eliminates the 5-year waiting period before a county or municipality can begin to purchase extra years of coverage. Also, it would change rules regarding reductions in UC that result from wages earned as a volunteer firefighter, emergency medical technician, or first responder. The elimination of the 5-year waiting period has no state fiscal impact. The impact on local costs cannot be determined as contributions will vary by county or municipality. There is insufficient information available to determine the financial impact of the UC change.

By statute, total state service awards are limited to \$2 million each fiscal year. In FY05, \$1.3 million was paid in awards. Based on the above information, the state match appropriation would still remain well below the \$2 million threshold as the result of this bill.
