Among other things, *Senate Bill 5* would create a Joint Committee on State Mandates, consisting of three majority party and two minority party senators and three majority party and two minority party representatives to the Assembly, appointed as are members of standing committees in their respective houses.

Senate Amendment 1 changes the membership of the Joint Committee on State Mandates, so that it would consist instead of five majority party and five minority party members divided equally between the Senate and Assembly, appointed as are members of standing committees in their respective houses.

Legislative History

On March 23, 2005, the Senate Committee on Veterans, Homeland Security, Military Affairs, Small Business and Government Reform introduced Senate Amendment 1 and recommended adoption of the amendment on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0. On the same day, the committee recommended passage of the bill as amended, also on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
