Statement of Amendment Intent: In fiscal year 2008, provide \$ 180,00 GPR to the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) to be distributed equally to the nine existing Child Advocacy Centers in Wisconsin to be used for education, training, medical advice and quality assurance, and in each subsequent fiscal year, provide \$180,000 to support these programs. In addition, in FY 2008, provide \$60,000 GPR to the Department of Justice (DOJ) to be distributed equally to three Child Advocacy Centers in development in Brown, Racine and Walworth Counties to be used for education, training, medical advice and quality assurance.

Wisconsin Children's Advocacy Centers

Children's Advocacy Centers are unique community partnerships dedicated to a coordinated team approach by professionals pursuing the truth in child abuse investigations. By bringing together professionals from law enforcement, criminal justice, child protective services, victim advocacy agencies and the medical and mental health communities, CACs provide comprehensive services for child victims and their families. As a result, CAC programs work to minimize trauma, break the cycle of abuse and provide communities with an added bonus: increased prosecution rates for perpetrators.

Studies have shown that:

- Investigations using a CAC show more coordination and information sharing between agencies.
- More children in CAC's receive forensic medical evaluations
- More children in CAC's are referred for Mental Health Services
- More parents of children using a CAC report they are satisfied with the investigation.
- Criminal cases investigated using CAC's have:
 - More criminal cases filed
 - More alleged Perpetrators plead guilty
 - More guilty findings on cases taken to trial
- There is a significant cost saving to communities using a CAC model for investigation.

This widely acclaimed Best-Practice model for investigation and service delivery began in Alabama in 1985. Today there are over 600 programs across the country. In Wisconsin the first CAC's were opened in 1992. During that year both the Care House in Rock County and the Child Protection Center in Milwaukee began operations. Today there are nine operating Children's Advocacy Centers in the following locations:

- Care House in Janesville serving Rock County
- Child Protection Center in Milwaukee serving primarily Milwaukee County
- Safe Harbor in Madison serving Dane County
- Kenosha CAC in Kenosha serving Kenosha County
- Fox Valley CAC in Neenah serving Winnebago, Outagamie and Calumet Counties
- Stepping Stones in LaCrosse serving LaCrosse County
- CARE Center in Waukesha serving Waukesha County
- CAC of Northeastern Wisconsin in Wausau serving primarily Marathon County
- Chippewa County CAC serving Eau Claire and Chippewa Counties

In addition, CAC programs are currently under development in Brown, Racine and Walworth counties.

CAC's are partnership programs bringing together many agencies in communities. Typically a CAC partnership will include law enforcement, child welfare, health, mental health, prosecution, victim services, schools and public health. These rather complicated partnerships develop because the systems involved all share the vision of enhanced services to children and families provided in a sensitive, child-friendly and accessible fashion.

CAC's benefit children and families by helping to coordinate assessments and investigations from a number of different sources. This is not only a convenience factor but reduces stress in these child victims and their families by reducing the number of times children must be interviewed, and increasing information gathered about the abuse they have suffered.
