AN ACT to amend 79.14, 115.341 (1), 121.58 (2) (a) 4., 121.905 (1), 121.91 (2m) 1 2 (e) (intro.), 121.91 (4) (f) 1., 121.91 (4) (f) 1m. b. and 121.91 (4) (f) 1m. c.; and to 3 *create* 20.255 (2) (dn), 115.28 (44) and 121.91 (8) of the statutes; **relating to:** state finances and appropriations for state school aids for the 2007–09 fiscal 4 5 biennium, school district revenue limits, school safety grants, the pupil transportation reimbursement rate, the school breakfast reimbursement rate. 6 7 county and municipal aid, the school levy property tax credit, and making 8 appropriations.

9 **SECTION 1.** 20.005 (3) (schedule) of the statutes, as it affects 20.255 (1) (b) of the statutes, is repealed and recreated to read:

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2008-09 STATUTE, AGENCY AND PURPOSE Source Type 2007-08 20.835 Shared revenue and tax relief (1) SHARED REVENUE PAYMENTS (db) County and municipal aid account GPR S 854,703,200 854,703,200 **SECTION 4.** 20.255 (2) (dn) of the statutes is created to read: 20.255 **(2)** (dn) *School safety grants.* The amounts in the schedule for grants to school districts under s. 115.28 (44). **Section 5.** 79.14 of the statutes is amended to read: **79.14 School levy tax credit.** The appropriation under s. 20.835 (3) (b) is \$319,305,000 in 1994, 1995, and 1996; \$469,305,000 beginning in 1997 and ending in 2006; and \$593,050,000 beginning in 2007 and ending in 2008; and \$793,050,000 in each year thereafter. **SECTION 6.** 115.28 (44) of the statutes is created to read: 115.28 (44) SCHOOL SAFETY GRANTS. From the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (dn), annually award grants to reimburse school districts for costs allowable under the federal Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act, 20 USC 7101 to 7165, but not paid under that act. If the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (dn) in any fiscal year is insufficient to pay all claims under this subsection, the funds shall be prorated among the school districts entitled to the funds. **Section 7.** 115.341 (1) of the statutes is amended to read: 115.341 (1) From the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (cm), the state superintendent shall reimburse each school board 10 15 cents for each breakfast served at a school that meets the requirements of 7 CFR 220.8 or 220.8a, whichever is applicable, and shall reimburse each governing body of a private school 10 15 cents

1 for each breakfast served at the private school that meets the requirements of 7 CFR 2 220.8 or 220.8a, whichever is applicable. 3 **Section 8.** 121.58 (2) (a) 4. of the statutes is amended to read: 4 121.58 (2) (a) 4. school year, the limit otherwise applicable under sub. (2m) (e) is increased by the additional amount that would have been calculated had the there been no decline in enrollment been 25 percent of what it was.

SECTION 13. 121.91 (4) (f) 1m. c. of the statutes is amended to read:

121.91 **(4)** (f) 1m. c. For the school year beginning on the 2nd July 1 following the effective date of the school district reorganization, if the average of the number of pupils enrolled in that school year and the previous school year is less than the average of the number of pupils enrolled in the 2 previous school years, the limit otherwise applicable under sub. (2m) (e) is increased by the additional amount that would have been calculated had the there been no decline in average enrollment been 25 percent of what it was.

SECTION 14. 121.91 (8) of the statutes is created to read:

121.91 **(8)** If a school district's initial revenue limit for the current school year, as calculated under s. 121.905 or sub. (2m) (e), whichever is appropriate, before making any adjustments under sub. (3) or (4), is less than the amount determined by multiplying the amount under sub. (2m) (e) 1. by the average of the number of pupils enrolled in the 3 preceding school years, the school district's initial revenue limit for the current school year, before making any adjustments under sub. (3) or (4), is the amount determined by multiplying the amount under sub. (2m) (e) 1. by the average of the number of pupils enrolled in the 3 preceding school years. Any additional revenue received by a school district as a result of this subsection shall not be included in the base for determining the school district's limit under sub. (2m) for the following school year.
