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

Any questions regarding the drafting of this bill can be directed to Eric Hanson 6-0620

We are looking at introducing legislation that would prevent a registered sex offender from purchasing and/or possessing a GPS jamming device. The GPS jamming device sends out a radio signal that interferes with satellite tracking. We understand that Wisconsin Statute 946.465 (**see below**) relates to tampering with a GPS device, but there is no mention of tampering with the transmission of the signal.

- Under current state statute 946.465, Tampering with a global positioning system tracking device. Whoever, without the authorization of the Department of Corrections, intentionally tampers with a global positioning system tracking device or comparable technology that is provided under s. 301.48 is guilty of a Class I felony.

We ask that this bill draft request remain confidential. This request is not considered urgent and does not have to be given priority over other pieces of legislation.

1 AN ACT ...; relating to: interfering with a signal transmitted by a global
2 positioning system and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the department of corrections (DOC) monitors the movements of certain sex offenders via a global positioning system tracking device. It is unlawful for any person to tamper intentionally with a global positioning system tracking device that is used by DOC to monitor the movement of a sex offender. A person who does so is guilty of a Class I felony and is subject to a fine not to exceed \$10,000, imprisonment not to exceed 3 years and 6 months, or both.

This bill makes it unlawful for any person to tamper with, or interfere with a signal transmitted by, a global positioning system tracking device that is used by DOC to monitor the movement of a sex offender. Anyone who does so is guilty of a Class I felony.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report concerning the proposed penalty and the costs or savings that are likely to result if the bill is enacted.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
