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

Thanks, John. Just to clarify a few points, this concerns the creation of regional "long-term care districts" (per the state budget) to operate Family Care programs. These districts are created by but operated independently of the counties. Our counties already have passed the required resolution to form a district, and we're in the process of finalizing our Board. We now expect to begin operation of the district in the third or early fourth quarter of 2008, so the legislation referenced below would ensure staff who transfer from the counties to the District would maintain continuous WRS coverage. Several other consortia who will be implementing similar programs are interested in this issue as well. Hope that helps!

Hi Rick. Thanks for taking my call earlier.

I've had a request from La Crosse County, who is acting on behalf of a consortium of adjacent counties to create a long-term care authority. This would be a new, quasi-government entity whose purpose would be running county nursing homes.

One of the issues La Crosse County has into concerns Wisconsin Retirement System participation for employees of the new authority.

The authority would like to begin employing county staff who transfer over the authority. in the third quarter of 2008. Here is where WRS enters the picture.

Their governing board for the new authority won't officially be in place until after all board of the participating counties pass resolutions creating the District, and then the board members of the new authority would have be approved.

By law, the governing board of a public organization seeking WRS participation needs to submit a resolution requesting WRS eligibility by November 15 of a year in order to begin participation during the following year. The long-term care authority is just gearing up, and was not able to make this request last November. (Their target date for implementing the authority is this May 15th, 2008.)

Without the guarantee of state retirement benefit continuation, I am told, massive bumping likely would ensue, creating havoc for everyone unless the authority delays implementation even longer (also not a good option).

Melissa Gilbert of La Crosse County has been the sparkplug on this. She tells me that she has talked to Rep. Musser and Sen. Vinehout, and they seemed willing to help with legislation if that is the needed approach.

In speaking with our WCA counsel, Andy Phillips of Phillips Centofanti and Stevens in Mequon, Melissa and I concluded that one possible solution might be to introduce a bill that allows a second window during the year (e.g. approve a resolution by May 15 in order to begin participation on July 1).

We'd like the legislation drafted broadly rather than narrowly. We know that other counties may be looking at taking steps similar to what the wets-central group is doing, and we'd like the bill to be broad enough to help any future long-term care authority instead of just being aimed at the "La Crosse group." However, we do want to limit the bill to county-originated long-term-care authorities.

Since WCA no longer has direct drafting authority, Melissa will be touching base with the offices of Musser and Vinehout to see if they would still be willing to submit this request from their offices.

Thanks Rick, we look forward to working with you on this draft.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

* This bill provides that if the governing body of a long-term care district adopts a resolution to elect to become a participating employer in the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) before May 15 of any year and official notice of that election is received by the Department of Employee Trust Funds (DETF) on or before May 15, the effective date of the participation of the long-term care district is the ensuing July 1. This differs from current law, which provides that, if an employer adopts a resolution to elect to become a participating employer in the WRS before November 15 of any year and official notice of that election is received by DETF on or before November 15, the effective date of the participation of the long-term care district is the ensuing January 1.

Because this bill relates to public employee retirement or pensions, it may be referred to the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems for a report to be printed as an appendix to the bill.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1

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SECTION 1. 40.21 (1r) of the statutes is created to read:
40.21 (1r) Notwithstanding sub. (1), if the governing body of a long-term care district, created under s. 46.2895 (1), adopts a resolution to elect to become a participating employer before May 15 of any year and official notice of that election is received by the department on or before May 15, the effective date of the participation of the long-term care district is the ensuing July 1.
