## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

If enacted, this bill would require state and local governments to attempt to ensure that at least 2 percent of the total amount expended for products and services is from Wisconsin-based businesses. In any fiscal year, the percentage of the total amount expended from Wisconsin-based businesses may not be lower than it was in the previous fiscal year.

Under current law, DOA has an exception to the requirement to award orders or contracts to the lowest bidder to give preference to Wisconsin producers, distributors, suppliers, and retailers over any out-of-state vendor that is domiciled in a jurisdiction that grants a preference to vendors domiciled in that jurisdiction. State agencies and the University of Wisconsin campuses in FY07 purchased \$1.0 billion of goods and services under §16.75, Wis. Stats. Applying the purchasing goal of this bill to the FY07 spend results in a goal of \$20 million of expenditures to Wisconsin-based businesses from state agencies.

Data is not available that would show whether enacting this 2 percent goal would either increase or decrease the cost of goods and services to provided state agencies. Therefore, the actual cost to state agencies of expanding the preference to Wisconsin-based businesses is indeterminate.

There is also no accumulative data on the total amount of purchases made in FY07 by local units of government. Therefore, it is not possible to determine what the 2 percent goal would be either in a cumulative or individual basis.
