Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates new civil and criminal penalties for persons who violate statutes or administrative rules regulating commercial dog breeders. Violation of the provisions involves forfeitures (civil penalties) for first offenses. Second or subsequent offenses may result in violators being charged with misdemeanors that involve fines and/or imprisonment (criminal penalties).

In addition, the bill creates the right to a civil cause of action for persons who are attempting to enforce various remedies described in the bill.

It is impossible to predict how many civil or criminal actions will be filed in the circuit courts as a result of this bill. Additional proceedings require additional judge, court reporter, court staff and juror time. These costs are borne by both the state and the county. These crimes could also result in additional jail costs for the counties. An accurate estimate of the additional costs is impossible with the data available.
