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Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Currently the Department collects cancer diagnosis information from entities that are required to provide this information, including hospitals, physicians, and certain laboratories. Patient confidentiality requirements apply to this information.

SB 415 allows the Department to disclose confidential cancer information to a qualified researcher who requests it and who uses the information for the study of cancer and cancer prevention. The bill specifies the protocol a researcher must follow to apply for this information.

The requirements of this bill, especially the confidentiality and security requirements, will result in additional workload for the Department, which cannot be absorbed by current staff. Based on information from other states which have similar requirements, the Department will need 1.0 GPR FTE, a Research Analyst 6, to perform these duties, at a cost of \$90,800 GPR annually. This cost includes \$48,700 for salary, \$22,500 for fringe benefits, and \$19,600 for supplies and services. The duties which this position will perform include updating cancer registry policies and procedures, maintaining and updating appropriate administrative rules, responsibility for data use agreements and confidentiality statements, development and maintenance of a data base for tracking requests, working with researchers to ensure appropriateness of requests and to answer questions the researchers may have, and the production of reports.

SB 415 allows the Department to impose a reasonable fee on a researcher who obtains information under the provisions of this bill. Based on the experience of other states, it is estimated that revenue from these fees would vary annually depending on the number of requests. Any revenue collected from these fees would offset the GPR expenditures for the 1.0 FTE.
