Description Relating to: free access to state parks and state trails by certain disabled veterans and former prisoners of war							

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SUMMARY: The bill exempts Wisconsin residents who were prisoners of war (POWs) and residents with a 70 percent or greater military-related disability from the requirement that they have a vehicle admission sticker to enter state parks (including Heritage Hill State Park) or that they pay a fee to use state trails. In addition, the bill requires that the Department issue a card to those residents who qualify for these exemptions.

FISCAL EFFECT: This bill will decrease Department revenues, generate one-time costs, and increase annual operating costs. The Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) reports that 9,415 veterans would now qualify for free admission to state parks and trails on the basis of disability. (The DVA does not have precise data on the number of POWs among Wisconsin residents, but assumes the number to be less than 100. For purposes of this fiscal estimate the Department assumes there are 85 POWs that are Wisconsin residents.) The Department assumes that the percentage of former POWs and disabled veterans visiting state parks and southern forests mirrors the percentage of all Wisconsinites over age 18 that visited state parks (9.58%) and southern forests (2.96%) in 2006. The Department further assumes that the participation rate for disabled veterans using state trails will be further reduced by 30%. Based on these assumptions, the Department assumes that the Wisconsin State Park System would generate approximately \$42,300 less in admission revenues annually as a result of this bill.

The Department assumes that the Department of Veterans' Affairs would issue documentation to disabled veterans and former POWs that those persons would present to the Department to certify their eligibility for free state park and trail admission. The Department further assumes that one-half, or 4,750, of the 9,500 eligible veterans would request a card in the first year, generating one-time expenses of \$28,000 in salary and fringe, data processing, and other supplies related expenditures such as updating manuals and training materials and card design and printing. The Department further assumes that it will annually issue stickers and trail passes to eligible card-holding veterans, and that the number of additional card holding veterans will grow by 200 annually, resulting in ongoing annual staff, administrative and supplies costs of approximately \$6,000.
